Resolution 192

Calling for the Immediate Release of NYCPS Student Arrested by ICE on May 21, 2025

WHEREAS, the District 30 Community Education Council (CEC 30) wholeheartedly embraces its commitment to creating and maintaining a safe and welcoming environment for all New York City Public Schools (NYCPS) students, staff, and families;

WHEREAS, it is the policy of NYCPS to provide equal educational opportunities without regard to national origin, alienage, or citizenship status;¹

WHEREAS, NYCPS students, staff and their families originate from many different countries besides the United States, may have received temporary legal status under Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals, may be asylum seekers, may be applicants for Special Immigration Juvenile Status,² may be undocumented, and/or may live in mixed status households (meaning one or various members of the family can be undocumented while others have some kind of temporary or permanent status);

WHEREAS, NYCPS reflects the diverse population of the world, which our schools celebrate in many ways;

WHEREAS, District 30 is home to immigrants from across the globe, and our schools have welcomed a particularly large number of new immigrants over the past four years;³

WHEREAS, on May 21, 2025, a student at the English Language Learners and International Support Preparatory Academy, an NYCPS transfer high school in the Bronx, was arrested by Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) agents while he attended a mandatory court hearing pertaining to his application for asylum and for Special Immigration Juvenile Status, and since then has been moved to New Jersey, Texas, Louisiana, and Pennsylvania, spending most of that time with his hands and feet cuffed;

WHEREAS, the May 21, 2025, arrest of this NYCPS student was the first known example of a current NYCPS student being detained by ICE during the second administration of President Donald Trump;⁴

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that CEC 30 condemns the detention of this NYCPS student and calls upon Mayor Eric Adams to appeal to the Trump administration for the detained student's immediate release so that he may return to his family and to his NYCPS school.
